At one time, Bob was a member of the Corvallis Country Club, the Oregon State University Beaver Club, the Tillicums, and the Corvallis Elks Lodge. He was one of the outstanding trap shooters on the Elks' team. He had a trophy case full of first-place finishes from both in Oregon and out of the state.

Hunting was his passion. The duck pond he owned with three others was truly a place he enjoyed from the minute he bought the property until it was sold. The new owner respected Bob so much he officially named it Burger Pond.

Bob took great pride in keeping his yard and garden well tended into his 90s. He was the most honest man you would ever meet, hardworking and dedicated to all who knew him. He was the quiet strength of his family, never saying a lot, but showing his family how to live their lives by his own character and example.

He will be greatly missed by all who had the honor of knowing him.

Bob leaves behind Claranell, his wife of 71 years; son Ray Hardenburger; daughter Phyllis Peterson and her husband, Robert; grandchildren Kim Moreland, Derron Moreland (and wife Melanie), David Hardenburger (and wife Andrea), Katie Dolby (and husband Michael), and Rob Peterson (and wife Janelle); 15 great-grandchildren; sister-in-law Grace Zwahlen; and numerous nieces and nephews.
